


U+0020 SPACE



- Nothing in the earliest written texts
- Either unnecessary or minimalistic fragments



- Alphabetic systems have more need of word separation
- Most popular was *interpunct* (a·word)
- But also slashes, bars, triangles, multiple dots



- Vowels make word separation a little less urgent
- ‘scriptio continua’ became a Greek fashion
- ...and was copied by the Roman empire

An actual 'space' was not used until the early middle ages


